1. Separate Your Paragraphs- skip a line between each paragraph .

Don't start a new line for each new sentence!

2. Remember to state your opinion in the opening paragraph.

The most important part of an opinion essay is YOUR OPINION.

3. Don't Repeat Your Argument. Provide NEW Examples in each paragraph. Make sure that each of your arguments is distinct and different from the others. Points which are very similar to each other should be grouped together as one argument, in the same paragraph! In addition, you must provide examples to support each of your arguments.

4. Use CONNECTORS and Varied Vocabulary - The second, third and fourth paragraphs should each start with a connector. Also, use useful language throughout the essay as well. Using connectors, varied vocabulary will improve your final mark!
