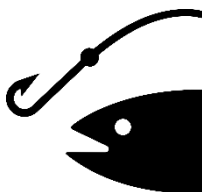

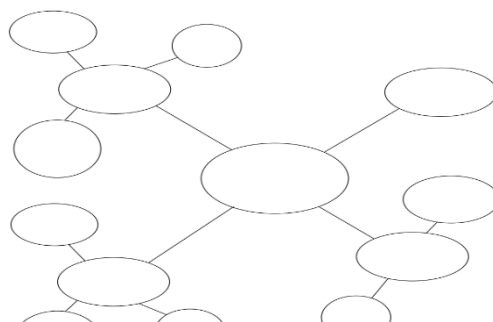
Step 2- Clustering

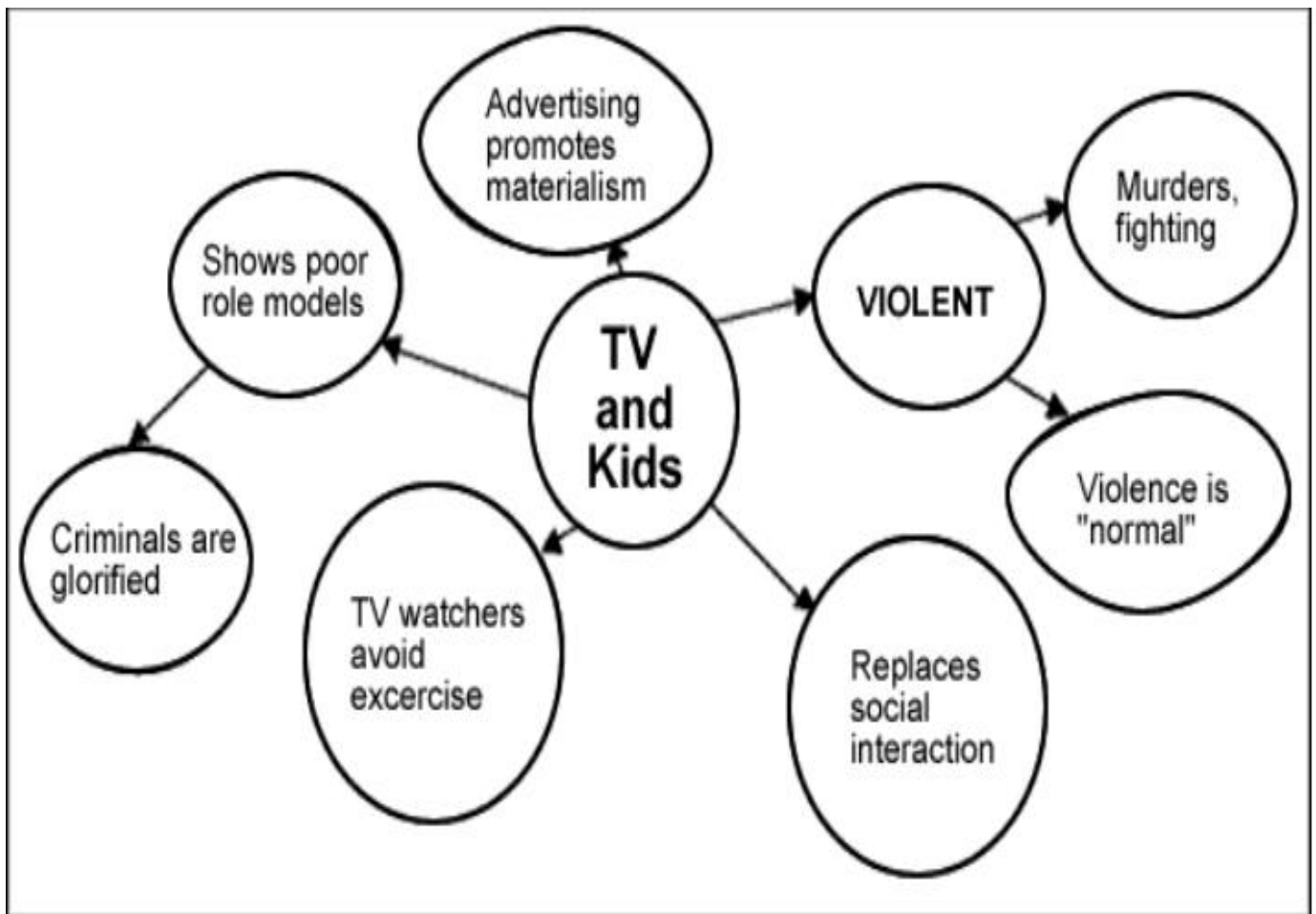
Clustering is a strategy which allows you to see your ideas visually and explore the connection between them. In other words, it helps you decide which ideas go together

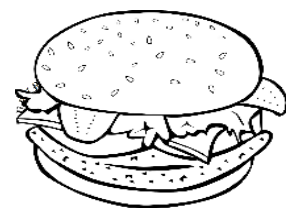
